Picking up a golf club at the age of 8 I made an instant connection with the game always striving to perform to the best of my ability.

As a young boy I was brought up playing golf at Aboyne Golf Club located 20 miles west of Aberdeen and at the age of 11 I started playing in competitive handicap competitions and gained my first official handicap of 36 during the start of 2009. From the point of gaining my first handicap I was hooked to the game and pushed myself to performing to the best of my ability. Over the years to come I would struggle with my confidence on the golf course which resulted in a slump in my handicap reduction. From this point I realised I needed professional advice to take my game to the next level. I conducted a 1-hour session with my club professional which made a large impact on my game.

A result of this was my best season as a junior golfer which I reduced my handicap by 9 shots in the summer of 2015, from this point I realised a career in the golf industry was goal.

In my time at the University of the Highlands and Islands I played for both the 1st and 2nd team in competitive BUCS matches across the 3 years I spent at the university. The benefits I took away from playing university golf was that I managed to reduce my handicap down from 6 to 1 and I learned how to play the challenging test of 'Links Golf'.
